## Academic Enrichment Activities

Jean presented all the academic enrichment offerings that we have at Ridge for the children in grades 2-5.

1. Spelling and Geography Bees (grades 4-5)

Recently, Ridge hosted Spelling and Geography Bees for our fourth and fifth grade students.
For the Geography Bee, which is geared for grades 4-8 nationally, 55 children took the qualifying test and 13 of them qualified ( 4 of them fourth graders). The winner of the Geography Bee was Liam Rooney, a fifth grader. Next, he will go on to take an online geography test to see if he qualifies for the NJ State Geography Bee.

The Spelling Bee started with 75 children, and the winner was Nathan Kotchin, a two-time winning fifth grader. Next, he will participate in the Regional Spelling Bee.

## 2. Continental Math League (grades 2-5)

This is a math enrichment league with challenging word problems that are scored. Ridge submits all scores to the Continental Math League, and the top performers get recognized with awards at the end of the year. This enrichment activity is open to all children in grades 2-5.

## 3. Perennial Math (grades 3-5)

This activity has math problems similar to the Continental Math League but is only open to children in grades 3,4 , and 5 .
4. New Jersey Math Contest (grades 4-5)

In the Spring, we will host the Math Contest which will consist of 30 multiple choice math questions. The winner will receive a book of math problems.

## 5. Thinking Cap Quiz Bowl (grade 5)

Headed up by Mrs. Mitchell, The Quiz Bowl is a general knowledge activity where you work in teams. In the Bowl, the fifth graders get rewarded for how quickly they can answer the questions correctly.

## 6. Writing Enrichment Activity

Jean is currently searching for a writing enrichment activity for the fifth graders.
Overall, a lot of the enrichment activities skew towards the upper grades because the older children have the maturity to participate in them.

## Read Aloud Book

This month, the book we are reading is "Have you Filled a Bucket Today?" authored by Carol McCloud.

The overall premise of the book is that if we treat a person kindly, we fill his/her bucket rather than by doing something mean which takes away from his/her bucket.

## Lunchtime Stars

Lunchtime Stars will be debuted in the upcoming ROC assembly on Friday. Jean will ask the lunch aides to look out for children who do something nice, kind, or helpful. For those children that are recognized, Jean will hang up a star with their name on it in the cafeteria. We had this program a few years ago, and Jean found it to be effective the last time she implemented it.

## Reading Marathon

Reading Marathon Month occurs during the month of February. This marathon is a fundraiser for the Ridgewood Public Library.

Ridge would like $100 \%$ participation from all families.

## One School/ One Book

In February, our school will be participating in One School/ One Book where all the children will read the same book. This year we are reading the book Cheese, authored by Sarah Weeks. This book is a quirky and funny story about Oggie Cooder and his unique talent. We are kicking off this program on the $30^{\text {th }}$ of January and ending on March $6^{\text {th }}$.

We will have a schoolwide video conference with the author.
