PARCC Results (Grades 3,4,5)

Jean handed out a document listing a summary of Ridge PARCC results from Spring 2017. Overall, Ridge students continue to do very well compared to district and state. The document included the expectations levels. We are comfortably in 'Meet Expectations' for both Math and English Language Arts (ELA) and moving towards 'Exceeded Expectations'.

She mentioned that she and the 5th grade teachers can now look at three years of data and look at trends. Jean reminded the group that these scores are only one piece of information in our children's education.

Mindfulness and Gratitude

Our Book of the Month is *I am Peace* by Susan Verde, illustrated by Peter Reynolds. This book teaches children about the importance of mindfulness and how to find peace from it. We are trying to help children live in the moment and learn how to calm themselves down. Some children get overexcited and then make bad choices. Mindfulness helps them calm down.

This year, our school theme is gratitude. Jean will visit all the classes this month to talk about gratitude and how they should always look at the positive side of things. Every class will get a gratitude jar where the children can jot down what they are grateful for. She encourages everyone at home to create a gratitude jar and use it during the Thanksgiving holiday.
